OSSD Requirements

- 30 credits total ... including 2 eLearning unless you opt out
 - 18 compulsory credits
 - 4 Religion credits
 - 8 elective credits



40 Hours of Community Service
Successful completion of the OSSLT or Literacy Course (OLC401)

Full Disclosure

- All Grade 11 and 12 courses & marks will show on a student's transcript.
- All <u>dropped</u> courses (if dropped after midterm deadline) and <u>failed</u> courses will be included (with '0' credit value).
- Repeated credits:

 - ALL attempts will appear

Compulsory Gr. 11 Credits

World Religions (one of):

O HRF301 (w/NBE3C1 or ENG3E1)

 If you select Open Religion, you will not be able to change to M Religion as # of classes are based on your choices

Compulsory Gr. 11 Credits

Math (one of):

- MCR3UY (Pre-AP)
- MCR3U1 (University prep)
- MCF3M1 (University/College prep)
- MBF3C1 (College prep)
- MEL3E1 (Workplace prep)

Gr. 11 Math Credit

- More beneficial to choose a course type where you will build on your skills
- An inappropriate choice can lead to:
 not earning the credit <u>OR</u>
 - passing but not achieving the grades that will allow you to progress
 - i.e. marks that do not meet admissions requirements
- Just as there are many post secondary options that do require Math, there are also many that do <u>not</u>!

Gr. 11 Math Credit

MCR3UY (AP-Prep)

- MUST also choose MHF4U1 (will go in S2 of Gr. 11) if taking MCV4UY in Gr. 12
- MCR3U1 (University prep)
 - >75% in MPM2D1
- MCF3M1 (University/College prep)
 - min. 65% in MPM2D1 <u>or</u>
 - >75% in MFM2P1
- MBF3C1 (College prep)
 - MFM2P1
- MEL3E1 (Workplace prep)
 - \circ MAT2L1 or 50s in MFM2P1





You can take more than one Math or English course in a school year so as to reinforce your skills! *i.e. MCF3M1 & MCR3U1*

UNIVERSITY PREP SCIENCES

- Require strong Level 3 achievement in SNC2D1 and good-excellent learning skills
- Planning on SBI4U1 in Gr. 12?
 Take both SBI3U1 & SCH3U1 in Gr. 11 as 3 units in SBI4U1 require concepts taught in SCH3U1 for success *i.e.* bonding, nomenclature, organic chemistry
- Interested in Bachelor of Science programs (i.e. Life or Health Sciences)?
 - Take all 3 Gr. 11 Sciences → SBI3U1, SCH3U1, & SPH3U1

Elective Credits

Check your Group requirements!



 Choose your electives CAREFULLY so that you have the correct prerequisites for your desired Gr. 12 courses

• Need to know AT LEAST a general area of interest so as to plan appropriately

Elective Credits

- Can choose any course for which you have the prerequisite
- University/College → research program admission averages & requirements
- Apprenticeship → review courses/subjects in which a strong knowledge/skill base is needed or recommended
- Take Co-op so as to explore potential careers & build transferable work skills!

Elective Credits

- Talk to teachers, peers, family, & Guidance counsellors
- Find complete course descriptions online in myBlueprint
- Unsuccessful on the Ontario Secondary Literacy Test (OSSLT) → choose OLC401
 - fulfills literacy graduation requirement
 <u>AND</u>
 - counts as a credit just as any other course!

Cooperative Education

- What is it?
 - experiential learning that links academics with work experience (placement)
- Who can/should take co-op?
 Gr. 11 &/or 12 students and <u>ALL</u> pathways
- Choose from 2 credit (COOPHD \rightarrow half day) OR 4 credit (COOPFD \rightarrow full day)
- Submit <u>application</u> (download from Gr. 10 \rightarrow 11 infographic OR within myBlueprint)

Apprenticeship

- Use Co-op as an opportunity to explore and work in Apprenticeship occupations starting in Grade 11!
- Can be used to prepare for <u>OYAP</u> (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program) in Gr. 12
 Accelerated option available too!

Specialist High Skills Major

- Program that allows students to focus their learning on a specific industry while meeting the requirements to graduate:
- 1. Arts & Culture
- 2. Business
- 3. Construction (centralized)
- 4. Health & Wellness
- 5. Justice, Community Safety, & Emerg. Services
- 6. Transportation
- Declare <u>interest</u> in myBlueprint and bring completed <u>application</u> to Guidance office

Benefits of SHSM

- Customize your education to suit your interests, talents, & goals
- Develop specialized knowledge and skills
- Gain career-relevant training → resume, certifications, portfolio building, etc.!
- Applicable for ALL pathways → U/C/Workplace/Apprenticeship

Dual Credits

- 1 course = 2 credits!
 - college credit (transferable) <u>AND</u>
 - high school credit
- Offered after school or during the day (need co-op for day option)
- Can count towards SHSM requirement(s)
- Experience post secondary education while still in high school
- Try out a subject/area of interest prior to applying to post secondary
- Transportation may be included
YCDSB eLearning

- Can take a maximum of 1 eLearning course per semester
- Fully asynchronous (no direct/live instruction)
- Need excellent learning skills, high self regulation, & be very comfortable navigating an online learning platform
- All course offerings listed in myBlueprint
- Can opt out if desired \rightarrow form is on Class of 2026; once completed, bring to Guidance

• C, M, or U courses *including* ENG4C/U and specific program prerequisites

DEGREE programs (College or University):

 6 Grade 12 University (U) or University/College (M) prep courses including ENG4U and specific program prerequisites

Course Selection Timeline

- Course selections & SAF fee payment due: Tuesday, February 20th, 2024
- \$50.00 paid online via <u>School Day</u>
- DO NOT include course enhancement fees (will be collected by teacher in Sept./Feb.)
- Course selections are on a first come, first serve basis:
 - submission date will be used to determine enrollment in oversubscribed courses

Not 100% sure that you will be returning to SBA next year ??

- Complete your course selection to guarantee a timetable in case you decide to return
- \rightarrow School fees will be refunded minus a \$15.00 administration fee

IF absolutely sure → complete 'Not Returning Next Year' portion on myBlueprint



What happens next?

- The Course Verification period will occur after March Break:
 - will be accepted up to 5 days after
- Following this, changes will likely <u>NOT</u> be possible!
- Classes are based on <u>YOUR</u> selections

Frequently Asked Questions

 Course selection is due on Feb. 20th, but my appointment with my Guidance counsellor is after this date. What do I do?

STILL SUBMIT ON TIME!

- Do the best you can & book an appointment for later. We can always change, resubmit, and get parent/guardian approval again.
- Come to a trouble shooting session on Wednesday/Thursday (Feb. 21st & 22nd) during P1 in Room 212

Frequently Asked Questions

- If I change my mind about an elective course that I chose, can I change it?
- → There will be an opportunity to request changes at Course Verification *(following March Break)*
- Can I double up on courses, for instance: can I take Grade 11 'M' Math and Grade 11 'U' Math? YES! Great way to reinforce skills

Frequently Asked Questions

- Can I take a Grade 12 course?
- → Yes; plan for prerequisite course as well.
 *If courses are oversubscribed or have limited spots,
 preference will be given to Gr. 12's.
- Should Groups 1, 2, & 3 be completed by the end of Grade 11?

→ <u>Recommended</u> as many Gr. 12 courses require prerequisites so fulfilling Group requirements <u>after</u> Gr. 11 may prove challenging.
