

Tips

RESEARCH, RESEARCH, RESEARCH

- Need to have at least a general area of interest to make wise course selections
- Best case scenario is that you know what programs you are applying for and KNOW EXACTLY what you need ...pre reqs, supplemental app, portfolio, average required for admission, etc

Tips

Each year we run fewer classes

- You need to select classes that you need/want carefully as changes will most likely not be possible
- Alternate courses will be used as necessary without consultation ...make sure they are ones you will be happy taking

 - 18 compulsory credits
 - 12 elective credits
- 40 Hours of Community Service
 Successful completion of the OSSLT or Literacy Course (OLC401)


STEP #4

CHOOSE YOUR COURSES BASED ON WHAT YOU NEED TO GRADUATE + THE POST SECONDARY PREREQUISITES YOU NEED!

Choose 6 – 8 courses + 2 alts

For 1 **spare**, choose 7 courses, IF you have sufficient credits. For 2 spares, choose 6 courses, IF you have sufficient credits.

Choose ALTERNATES <u>carefully</u> as these will be used to fill in the space (s) if one or more of the courses you choose is cancelled.



Course Types

- Open courses e.g. PPL401
- Workplace preparation courses e.g. MEL4E1
- College preparation courses e.g. MAP4C1
- University/College (mixed) prep courses e.g. BOH4M1
- University preparation courses e.g. ENG4U1
- AP/University preparation e.g. ENG4UY
- eLearning e.g. ETS4U8


English

ENG 4U or ENG4C is a requirement for graduation and necessary for all post secondary programs To choose ENG4UY - must have taken **ENG3UY** as prerequisite OLC401 can be used as final English for graduation but is not applicable for post secondary admissions

Religion

HZT 4U1 – University (w ENG4U & strong learning skills) NOTE: if you choose Philosophy, switching to HRE4M1 WILL NOT be possible as # of classes are based on YOUR choices ...choose wisely!

- HRE 4M1 University (w ENG4U)
- HRE 401 College/Workplace/
 Apprenticeship (w ENG4C or ENG4E1)



Mathematics

- MCT4C1→ prerequisite is MCF3M1 or MCR3U1
- MCF3M1 students \rightarrow MCT4C1 \rightarrow Advanced Functions \rightarrow Calculus and Vectors
- Students who took MCR3U1 may also choose MCT4C1 to help prepare them for MHF4U1
- All grade 12 maths require STRONG foundational and learning skills

French Immersion

FIF4UQ - French Immersion FrenchHRE4MQ - French Immersion Religion

YCDSB eLearning

- can enroll in ONE eLearning course per semester as a day-school course (max of 2)
- Must have excellent learning skills & be comfortable in the online environment
- See list of course offerings in myBlueprint & on PRISM

Cooperative Education

- SHSM requirement, transferable skills, career exploration, start accruing apprenticeship hours
- Must also submit completed coop application ...link in myBlueprint or pick up in Guidance
- To place co-op in your course selection:
 - <u>2 credit</u>: COOPHD (half-day)
 - <u>4 credit</u>: COOPFD (full day)

(Interview will follow by end of June)

OYAP - ON Youth Apprenticeship Program

Students participating in OYAP:

- must have completed 26 credits prior to starting the program
- must be enrolled as full time students
- are required to complete all OSSD compulsory credits in sem 1

The Accelerated OYAP program benefits:

- Earn high school credits towards OSSD
- Register as an apprentice, earn hours/demonstrating competencies
- Complete part or all of their Level One apprenticeship schooling in a specific trade
- Make connections with employers/journeypersons to continue after graduation

Very competitive ...must have excellent attendance, strong work ethic, & good marks in related courses.

Dual Credits

- Some are offered during day, some after school – receive 2 credits → one high school, one college (transferable), eligible for SHSM requirements
- To participate during day, must be in co-op
- Transportation may be provided
- See list of <u>course offerings</u> and/or see your Guidance counsellor

Special Education

GLE401 - Advanced Learning Strategies

Students will be placed as peer mentors in a variety of settings within SBA, including the Functional Life Skills program with our special needs students

College Sciences

SPH4C1 - will be offered next year

If you need SCH4C1 you must take it via eLearning







Other Considerations

- Course load requirements
 - Choose a min. of 7 courses → 8 is even better!
- Grade 11 marks?
- Summer school, non-day school courses

NOTE: students may take a course once per school year, unless they change course type

Transcripts & Full Disclosure

- ALL completed courses + attempts (if not dropped within 5 days after midterm report) will show on transcript
- Repeating courses? CAN ONLY EARN CREDIT ONCE

Deadlines...

Course selections/SAF are due: Tuesday, Feb. 20

 Course selections are on a first come first serve basis...submission date will be used to determine enrollment in oversubscribed courses

Submit all fees &/or requirements...

- SAF paid via School-Day web app ...\$50.00
- If COOP chosen completed COOP application form must also be submitted
- Application is linked to course in myBlueprint or at bottom of infographic

- Classes are based on <u>your</u> selections
 CHOOSE <u>VERY CAREFULLY</u>
